INTERDISCIPLINARY SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY RESEARCH ACADEMY

To inculcate research interest and to transfer knowledge among students and staff, the parent M.C.E. Society established an Incubation Centre named as Interdisciplinary Science and Technology Research Academy (ISTRA) by providing seed money of rupees forty lakhs during the year 2010-11. The grant was provided to ISTRA to create new research facilities such as, Advanced Biological Science Laboratory (ABSL), Tissue Culture Laboratory and sophisticated instruments. In ISTRA, staff and students from Chemistry, Microbiology, Biotechnology, Botany and Computer Science are involved. To increase the spectrum of interdisciplinary research areas, faculty members and students from Abeda Inamdar Senior College, Allana College of Pharmacy, M. A. Rangoonwala College of Dental Sciences and Research Centre and Unani Medical College, Azam Campus are also involved.

The participating students and faculty are updated regularly on new scientific research and instrumental advances through research seminars and talks by national and international experts.

ERP SYSTEM OF AZAM CAMPUS


Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) System

GREEN CAMPUS PROJECT

Implemented Throughout the Azam Campus

This initiative includes the development of our entire 24 acre Campus into a model of complete sustainability and a zone of ecological balance. We plan to achieve this by implementing the principles of sustainability on primarily three fronts, these being — Water, Energy and Solid Waste. The better management of these three elements is a great start towards setting an example for the rest of the world that ecological preservation and development can go hand in hand and are not mutually exclusive. We have achieved this on all three fronts by the implementation of various sustainable technologies such as Rainwater Harvesting, Solar Power Generation, Organic Waste conversion, LED lighting etc. The ecological balance is achieved by the development of an outdoor area of the campus through which a fresh water canal flows into a zone meant especially for environmental studies and its implementation at all levels, right from school to post graduate and doctoral studies. This aspect also includes the implantation of artificial nesting all throughout the Campus to foster the lost habitat for birds in our area. This is being carried out in the name of C.E.S.S. PAI MADRASA DEVELOPMENT SCHEME

At present Madrasa students are left out of mainstream education system and cannot pursue career in fields other than Islamic Studies, as they do not fulfill minimum prescribed educational qualifications. Not only that they also face difficulties in day to day life as they do not possess documents such as leaving certificate, educational certificate that are recognized by the Government.

To overcome this, M.C.E. Society has initiated a special scheme named as "PAI Madrasa Development Scheme" to guide and support madrasa students to register themselves for Std. X (S.S.C.) and Std. XII (H.S.C.) at NIOS study center at Azam Campus and pursue higher education and become an asset to the community and the nation. Mr. Nasir Khan (9922412033) is in-charge of the scheme and co-ordinating with madrasa.

During this year 77 Madrasa students appeared for std. X (S.S.C.), conducted by NIOS. Entire expenses of these madrasa students were borne by the M.C.E. Society.

DINING ETIQUETTE WORKSHOP

M.C.E Society's M.A. Rangoonwala Institute of Hotel Management and Research conducted one day workshops on "Dining Etiquettes" for the students studying in the schools and colleges in Azam Campus at its state of the art restaurants. Around 1050 were trained during the year 2019-2020.

The workshop mainly focused on educating the students on dining etiquettes and lifestyle management. Besides learning, how to sit and eat a meal in a formal dining set-up, students



were also taught about good eating habits, stress management and responsible behavior on social media. An excellent presentation, demonstration and practice sessions were organized. Arrangements were made to create actual ambience by setting up dining tables and providing refreshments. Students were given insights on the importance of nutrition and implementation of a healthy lifestyle with know-how on physical exercise.

The workshop was a refreshing and a new experience for many students and it changed the general perspective about fine dining. It also promoted 'Eat Right' movement of the Food Safety and Standards Authority of India. The students emerged as better-informed gentlemen and ladies who would not feel intimidated by all the technical and exquisite terms one needs to know about when they talk about fine dining.

SPECIAL COACHING PROGRAMME TO PREPARE SSC (ATKT) STUDENTS

The S.S.C. Board conducts supplementary S.S.C. Examination in July every year for the students who have failed in main examination conducted in March. If a student clears the subjects (ATKT) his admission to Std. XIth is continued and confirmed, thus saving his one year.

M.C.E. Society has introduced a scheme under which special coaching is imparted to such ATKT students to help them clear their backlog subjects. The coaching classes were conducted at Anglo Urdu Boys High School from 25th June to 13th July 2019, which was attended by 165 students from various schools in Pune namely Anglo Urdu Boys' High School, Anglo Urdu Girls' High School, M.C.E.S. English Medium School, Rafi Ahmed Kidwai School, Moledina High School, Lady Tahirunnisa Inamdar School and Dr. (Mrs.) N. D. Nagarwala School. Out of 165 ATKT students 115 students cleared SSC Examination in July 2019.
